<u>MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT JIM BAROSS</u> - We are approaching the annual health insurance renewal process; SDCERS info booklets are due to get to you in early June.

As you will read elsewhere, we will not hold a REA General Membership meeting in June but Board members will be on site to visit with you at the SDCERS Health Fair event. Stop by to say hello.

Some potentially substantial and hopefully beneficial changes that are being initiated by the REA Board include 1) our partnering with MEA to provide you with some interesting additional insurance choices - pet, travel, dental, eye, and several other insurance choices are going to be available to REA members through automatic deduction from pension payments if you choose, and 2) we will be selectively and carefully investing some of our Legal Defense funds from the

money market into an exchange traded fund account; a low cost and tax-efficient way to help build our legal defense fund.

What else is new? The CSDREA.org web site loads faster and we are working on some other improvements to its usability (is that a word?). Enjoy Summer's onset and I hope to see many of you at the Health Fair!

Suggestion from newest board member Shirley Hall to keep REA members informed: This month <u>Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)</u>

For pre-tax savings like a 401k or Supplemental Savings Plans there is a minimum amount that a retirement account plan owner must withdrawal annually starting when we reach 70 ½ years of age. There are <u>penalties</u> if you do not do this! Shirley took a class from Jeanne Bradford-Odorico, DM Wealth Management Group, 619-497-0404. If this situation of having re-tax savings applies to you, <u>please get informed!</u> An option would be to choose to have it be a charity contribution and not affect your gross income.

General Meeting Minutes - May 9, 2017 - Reported by Brad Jacobsen

The minutes for the April 2017 meeting and the April Treasurer's Report were approved.

President Jim Baross asked members to ratilfy a change to the By-Laws to clarify the definition of a Board quorum. The motion was approved on a voice vote with no opposition or abstentions.

Cynthia Queen of SDCERS announced that there is now a full SDCERS Board; at the next meeting the Board will vote on a recommendation from staff that a 2% COLA be approved. (editor's note: it passed!)

Open reenrollment begins June 5; the booklets are currently being printed and should arrive in early June. Finally, she reported that SDCERS staff ran a disaster-preparedness exercise to assure that in the event of a catastrophe, retirees' checks would still be deposited on time.

Vice-President for Advocacy Mike Bresnahan updated members on the proposal to offer additional insurance coverage to REA members, including dental, vision, travel, and pet insurance. Integrated Labor Solutions will act as broker through a new MEA

subgroup called San Diego Public Employees' Benefit Association (PEBA) that would comprise all MEA and REA members who wish to participate in the supplemental insurance program. Premiums would be paid through payroll deduction. Final details are still being worked out, but we hope to have this in place by open enrollment.

Chris Brewster informed members of a proposal to increase to move half of REA's Legal Fund from a stable but low interest-producing Money Market account into a more aggressive Exchange Traded Funds (ETF) investment with a far better return rate. We would rebalance the ETF portion of the investment periodically to maintain a 50/50 balance between the two investment strategies. This would keep at least half of our Legal Fund in a liquid account.

<u>PROGRAM</u> - Our speaker was Charlotte Sousa from Kaiser Permanente, who walked us through the basics of Medicare. She explained the different Parts, including qualifications and premiums. In a nutshell, Part A covers hospital, skilled nursing, hospice, and in-home care; Part B covers outpatient and physician services; Part C provides coverage through private carriers; and Part D covers prescription medications. She reminded us that you need to enroll before turning 65, preferably three months in advance; there are severe, lifelong fiscal penalties for not doing so. Farewell to Sylvia Tatum

There was not only a card for each member, there was a separate file for each retiree who was not a member (or maybe a potential member.) These cards contained the name, address, telephone number, email addresses, department(s), years of service, date of retirement, date of membership, date of birth, age, dues paid (or not,) date of death, and frequently there was an obituary attached to the card. Only the Personnel Dept. had more information, maybe.

Until recently, the only REA phone number and address was Sylvia's. She answered all the calls, read and responded to all the mail inquiries. And she kept tabs on dues, bills and payments. With the date of birth, she also alerted the Sunshine Lady when an 80th birthday card was due. And she did all of this and more with a smile. We never thanked her enough but will be eternally grateful.
